



Breaking into the Business

For the young actor

Back by popular request, our introductory seminar is ideal for parents and their teen actors. During the course of this one-day seminar you will learn from top industry professionals how to navigate Chicago's film, television and theatre markets. We will take the mystery out of where to get headshots, how to get a legitimate agent, what a casting director looks for in an actor, how and when to join the union, and scams that can cost you money and more. This day is packed with information that could take you years to gather. Bring a lunch. We supply beverages and snacks. Not recommend for children younger than 12. Feel free to come with or without your young actor.

Teen Conservatory

The Conservatory program is designed for the teen who is passionate about the craft and has the desire to learn about the world of the professional. The day includes classes on acting, scene study and on-camera. The day ends with "the professional class," exposing the student to a variety of techniques as well as business skills. We conclude the seven-week session with an excursion to see Remy Bumpo's Midwest premiere of "Humble Boy." We will attend the Literary Lecture before the show and a talk back with the cast afterwards. The class will wrap with a pizza dinner at Renaldi's.

Class is divided in two levels, limited to 10 students each. Level 1 is perfect for beginners or teens with a few classes and/or plays under their belt. Level 2 requires an audition or permission of the directors.

Monologue Workshop

Auditioning for Theatre

Ages 12 and up

Auditioning for Film and Television

Ages 12 and up (agent recommended)

Actors will spend two days working in front of the camera using film and TV sides. We will focus on script analysis skills essential to dynamic auditions. Learn how making specific choices can turn your audition into a callback! The actor will also learn to make technical adjustments between acting for the stage and acting for the camera. Auditioning for Commercials

This two-day workshop will cover a wide variety of commercial copy. We will focus on establishing relationship for single-person, two-person and MOS (improve) audition situations. Masters Class

Spend four Saturdays with Chicago's top professionals. On the third Saturday, have Steve Scott, Associate Producer of The Goodman Theatre, work your monologue at the Goodman. Wrap up this four-day intensive with Casting Director Mickie Paskal, at Tenner, Paskal and Rudnicke Casting, sharpening your on-camera skills. *April 30, May 7, 14 and 21; 10:30 AM- 4 PM; \$390.*

Triple Threat

This workshop is designed for our many students perplexed by the musical theatre audition. We have broken the audition process down into three parts. The cold reading (script analysis), voice (addressing character interpretation of a song and warding off nerves) and dance (learn how to pick up basic dance combinations commonly used in auditions).
